Dear Pro-Life Friend,

This issue of *Life News* is packed with important information which you shouldn't miss so I'll keep this brief. I'll begin by sharing with you words penned by Archbishop Oscar Romero, part of a longer prayer which I often reread when I feel the need to put things into perspective:

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us.

We cannot do everything and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that.

This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.

It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for God's grace to enter and do the rest.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders, ministers, not messiahs.

We are prophets of a future not our own.

The "something" your Long Island Coalition for Life does is to fight abortion, infanticide, assisted suicide and euthanasia. See Celeste Broyles' article on page 8 for a summary of how we have done this during this past year. You decide for yourself if we are doing our job "very well." For my part, I recognize its incompleteness and pray that God's grace will "enter and do the rest."

This fall's election returns certainly demonstrate that the end results are not within our sight; there is much work to be done. Two of God's workers who can serve to inspire us, who exemplify how our work should be carried on, passed to their eternal reward this year. Their years of unflagging dedication to affirming the sanctity of human life—right up till the time of their deaths—were clearly part of His magnificent enterprise.

In our September issue we memorialized Ray Murphy. Ray helped found the LICL and the Life Center of L. I. and was the initiator of numerous pro-life activities and events on Long Island. Then he moved to Florida and repeated his pro-life activism in the Sunshine State, working indefatigably for the babies even while fighting leukemia.

James P. McFadden, founder of the Human Life Foundation and Ad Hoc Committee in Defense of Life and publisher of the Human Life Review, was laid to rest in October. Like Ray, he worked diligently to protect human life even as he fought his own battle with cancer and saw his eldest son succumb to the same disease. As Ray Kerrison described him in the New York Post: "... he was a rock of a man who served God, family and country. He devoted most or his working life to protecting human life—even as he clung to it by one flimsy thread after another."

These men never quit—nor can we. Please help your Long Island Coalition for Life continue its defense of innocent human by using the coupon on page 11 and the enclosed envelope to contribute and/or volunteer. Please also pray that we may have the fortitude to persevere in our work as Ray and Jim did.

May you experience peace and joy in this holy season and may God bless you for your generosity on behalf of the least of His brothers and sisters.

THE 1998 LEGISLATIVE YEAR has ended. Bills not voted on must be reintroduced in 1999. However, the Partial-Birth Abortion (PBA) ban petitions we have been collecting the past few months will still be valid when the bill is reintroduced in 1999. Please call 516-751-8217 for updated petition forms and continue to collect signatures.

On a positive note, several new pro-life candidates were elected across the U.S. Pro-life Peter Fitzgerald defeated Senator Carol Mosley-Braun, a staunch pro-abortion advocate. The National Right To Life reports a net gain of one vote in the U.S. Senate on the PBA ban.

MICHIGAN voted against a state resolution to legalize physician-assisted suicide.

WASHINGTON and COLORADO resolutions to ban PBA failed.

IN NEW YORK STATE our Nassau/Suffolk prolife Senators and Assembly Members were reelected and the Right-To-Life Party received the 50,000 votes necessary to remain on the ballot for four more years.

A MIRACLE TO PONDER.....

(taken from a CNS/Newsday article of 9/18/98). A Family is Found For Turnpike Baby Pittsburgh—A newborn girl found naked, cut and bruised on the hot asphalt of the Pennsylvania Turnpike is getting a new family. A Pittsburgh-area couple who had already gone through pre-adoption screening will take the baby home for now.

On Monday, a turnpike maintenance worker found the baby just inches from tires of cars and trucks that sped by. Police and doctors believe she was tossed from a moving vehicle, leaving her to roll across the turnpike and onto the berm. "The only way to explain the distribution of the injuries is that she had to roll over the pavement. It's a miracle she did not sustain major internal injuries, "said her physician Dr. Henri Ford.

Callers interested in helping the girl swamped hospital phone lines. "We've been deeply moved by the outpouring of affection and love for that little girl," Ford said. That's something that should be underscored in light of this being such a callous act. It's testimony to the fact that human kindness still prevails."

FUNDING OF FETAL EXPERIMENTATION AND RESEARCH

Several requests have come in for information on the grant funding of major foundations that would be considered antilife. We obtained two lists and documentation from the American Life League and Buffalo Regional R.T.L. The following foundations and associations have been considered anti-life according to their response to letters sent to them requesting their positions on: a) fetal tissue use when that tissue is acquired from legally induced abortions done at any time during the nine months of pregnancy; b) human embryo research and/or experimentation; c) their official position on abortion:

There had been a ban on federal funding of fetal experimentation and research. President Clinton lifted that ban only two days after his Inauguration, on January 22nd, the anniversary of the Roe v Wade and Doe v Bolton Decisions. There are guidelines for human-to-human transplantation, but if you want to transplant fetal tissue into animals, this is allowable in most states. This type of experimentation is being conducted on an on-going basis, and our tax monies can be used for it. There is little supervision of this research. A committee was set up by President Clinton to look into the situation and set up guidelines. President Clinton disbanded the committee when The Michael Fund challenged in court the legality of those on the committee. Their regulations are still in place. Naturally, that gives little protection to the fetus.

In order to have live tissue, brain cells, and organs for research and transplant, the fetus must be alive when anything is removed and then frozen (cryopreservation). The methods used to procure these transplants are abortions induced by prostaglandins, D&E (dilation and extraction), hysterotomy (which is similar to a Cesarean section), or an abortion that is similar to the Partial-Birth (D&X) abortion. This was described to us personally by a former abortion clinic director, Carol Everett, and written about by Bernard Nathanson, M.D. Professor Linda Gourash, M.D. wrote in the Washington Post, "The 1989 Archives of Neurology published the most detailed description of this procedure, outlining that an unborn baby's brain must be selectively sucked out by a tube inserted in the mother's womb to insure that the living fetal brain cells are harvested in fresh transplantable condition. This process kills the fetus, who is then aborted."

The United Parkinson Foundation responded to the request for their position on the use of fetal tissue as follows. "... supports fetal tissue use when that tissue is acquired from legally induced abortions done at any time during the nine months of pregnancy." A portion of the March of Dimes response as to their position on fetal research. "... supports the use of fetal tissue research as one technique to broaden understanding of human biology and pregnancy outcome. The Foundation invests its resources in fetal tissue research as appropriate." The March of Dimes has a history of funding experimentation on fetal tissue and organs, awarding grants to doctors who favor non-therapeutic experiments on live, aborted babies. Two different grants funded researchers who isolated the reproductive tracts from preborn girls and boys and grafted them onto mice to develop a method for testing the teratogenic and carcinogenic effects of drugs. The American Diabetes Association's response was: "...the transplantation of islet cells from the fetal pancreas is one of the most innovative areas of diabetes research. A.D.A supports H.R.4 and S.1, which would prevent the banning of federal funding of research activities involving the transplantation of fetal tissue." In 1982, researchers reported "Pancreatic glands of human fetuses obtained from 31 consecutive legal abortions were used. The abortions were induced by prostaglandin." The age of the dead fetuses ranged from 4 1/2 to 7 months gestation. In 1984, The Fetal Pancreas Network began so that fetal tissue could be retrieved from preborn babies aged 4 - 6 months gestation when the Dilation and Extraction abortion procedure is used. This pancreatic tissue is used in the field of research on Diabetes Mellitus.

Any proposed legislation would only limit or restrict research in which federal monies are used. Research using private monies is not restricted in any way. We would be horrified to know of the types of ghoulish research being done which is not covered by any government restrictions. There are, however, some researchers who still have ethical standards when it comes to fetal research. Medical researcher Keith Crutcher told a gathering, "My own research has been focused with the hope of providing some information that might lead to the relief of pain and suffering... If I have to rely on the death of another individual in order to extend the life of another, I reject it...," Write to these organizations and get their personal responses before you consider donating!

Planned Parenthood Killing Babies Over the Phone!

On September 14, 1998, Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) announced that it had begun a program to give out prescriptions for "emergency contraceptives" (ECs) over the phone to women it had never seen before. In a Spring 1996 newsletter called Sex, Etc. printed by Rutgers University, Dr. Regina Friedman, medical director of PP of Greater Northern New Jersey was interviewed in a question and answer format about EC: Q - What is emergency contraception? How does it work, and when do you use it? A - "Basically, it's a birth control pill taken in high dosage. It changes the lining in the uterus so that the egg (i.e., new human being) cannot implant. You use emergency contraception when you've had unprotected intercourse around the time of your ovulation. It must be taken within 72 hours of intercourse". EC is a baby killing device. And it is a device that must be dispensed by prescription. According to the PPFA press release, "When a woman cannot come to the clinic during the 72 -hour window when EC is effective, PP will provide counseling and education about the method over the phone, and when appropriate, call in a prescription to a local pharmacist. PP has already provided this service to establish patients - it will now offer EC over the phone to first-time patients." This means that an 11 or 12 year old girl can have sex with an older boy call PP the next morning, PP will phone a prescription to the pharmacist, and the girl can pick it up and pay for it and her parents will never know about it! This from an organization that claims to be interested in the health of women! PPFA calls this new "service", Dial EC. It is available at only a few PPFA clinics around the country, but its availability will be expanded "as the demand grows." PPFA also said that it was emphasizing another "service" which it calls EC-To-Go. This consists of "emergency contraceptive" packs, which are sold to women ahead of time so they will have the pills at home in case they want it use them (i.e. kill a baby). "In addition to offering these innovative Dial-EC and EC-To-Go (products). PP is undertaking a three-year public education campaign to promote emergency contraception," said Gloria Feldt, president of PPFA. PPFA claims that EC will "prevent abortions," but this is a lie. You can't prevent abortion by killing babies in the womb at an earlier age. It simply is illogical. But, of course, much of what PPFA does is illogical. A visit to our web site (www.all.org) will lead you to A Declaration of Life, a document signed by over 90 physicians stating clearly that the birth control pill and ECs are devices that kill babies in the womb.



LONG ISLAND COALITION FOR LIFE YEAR IN REVIEW

During the past year, your Long Island Coalition for Life has striven to fulfill its mission of upholding the dignity of all human life from fertilization to natural death. Our particular concern with abortion and euthanasia has directed our efforts throughout the year. A summary of activities follow:

- Distributed 132,000 copies of "Life News"
- Sponsored four bus trips to Albany for local activists to lobby for prolife legislation
- Mailed educational information on "partial-birth abortion" to nearly 77,000 homes
- Participated in Women's Health Awareness Day at the Smith Haven Mall
- Sponsored two buses to the "25 Years of Tears" prolife rally in Albany
- Spoke to student groups at two colleges and three high schools
- Collected nearly 30,000 signatures on petitions supporting a ban on "partial-birth abortion"
- Mailed information to Suffolk County high schools regarding the anti-life agenda of Planned Parenthood's annual Teen Health Conference
- Sponsored "partial-birth abortion" ads on one Nassau and one Suffolk radio station and one Metro area TV Station
- Sponsored the Stand Up For Life public witness rally attended by 1000+ people
- Became a charter member of the newly formed Writers For Life to promote more and better letter-writing by prolifers
- · Assisted member groups in placing prolife ads in area college newspapers

In addition, the LICL provided information and literature to those who called us, supported the of prolife pregnancy assistance centers and promoted local prolife activities. We are considering more media advertising and have a program underway to donate Human Life International's prolife reference book, The Facts of Life, to Catholic high schools.

All of these accomplishments, big and small, have come about with the donation of time and services by board members, committee persons, the general membership, and volunteer supporters. A number of our activities have proceeded despite efforts by proabortionists or misinformed people to sideline our work. There is so much more to be done! Consider joining our efforts to whatever extent you are able. Next year the LICL would like to double its number of speaking engagements and halve the number of participants in Planned Parenthood pro-abortion programs. We continue to look for other avenues and opportunities to touch people with the "culture of life" and combat the "culture of death."

U.N. GLOBAL FORUMS:

Unacceptable Language, Logic & Leadership


The United Nations World Food Summit, held in Rome, Italy was the latest occasion for Lester Brown, infamous alarmist and president of the Worldwatch Institute, to trot out his oft-failed warnings of imminent food shortages and impending disaster. Brown's solution, of course, is population control. In 1978 Brown predicted that the "loss of cropland, food shortages, soaring food prices" and "soil degradation," aggravated by "growth in human numbers" would require a "fundamental rethinking of population policies."

The Reality: Food and Agricultural (FAO) figures show that world food availability per person increased from 2440 calories per day in 1969/71 to 2720 in 1990/92. In the developing countries calories per person increased from 2140 per day to 2520 over the same time period, an increase of 18%. And the number of people living in countries having less than 2100 per day per person fell from 1747 million in 1969/71 to 411 million in 1990/92, or by 76%!




