PLANNED PARENTHOOD AT ST. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE !

On October 18, 2000 the LICL corresponded with Sister Elizabeth A. Hill, President of St. Joseph's College in Patchogue, questioning the presence of Planned Parenthood (P.P.) at a HIV/ AIDS Peer Educator Conference for Teens at St. Joseph's College. Sister Hill is a member of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Brentwood. P.P. was one of the major sponsors of the conference and was responsible for two workshops. The conference was scheduled for early November. We also requested a meeting with Sister Hill to discuss, not only P.P.'s "safe sex" condom agenda, but the morality of aiding and abetting an agenda which places teens in harm's way.

To date, Sister Hill has failed to answer our concerns or our request for a meeting. It is our intent to point out to Sister that she should consider the following information concerning P.P.'s agenda. A N.Y. Times article of December 5, 1999, predicted there will be 40,000 new cases of HIV/AIDS. A previous article of March 9, 1998 stated that 230.8 million tax dollars had been spent on prevention of STD's (sexually transmitted diseases) and \$7.5 billion for treatment. These figures do not include monies spent on AIDS.

Lastly—U.S. Rep. T. Coburn, Oklahoma (OB/GYN) has stated that the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) is a "very insidious disease", is an emerging epidemic and condoms offer little or no protection. Dr. Coburn stated, "The scientific facts are irrefutable; condoms don't protect you against infection by the HPV, or they offer such limited protection that you will most probably get it anyway." (Washington Times) There are HPV strains that lead to cervical cancer which kills around 4,800 women a year, more than the number of women who die from AIDS. Another STD, largely impervious to condoms is Chlamydia, the leading cause of infertility among young women.

It is regrettable, in view of this information, that Sister Hill has not answered our correspondence and our request for a meeting. One would assume a leader of an educational institution would not provide a forum for P.P., which encourages teen sexual experimentation, promotes a potentially lethal risk "safer sex" agenda and abortion on demand. Educational institutions should not be venues for false, life-threating and misleading information at the conference, which imperils the lives of our teens. While one speaker presented the abstinence message, the HIV/AIDS Peer Workshop was dominated by P.P. and its anti-life, anti-family and anti-child agenda. It is unfortunate that Sister Hill was/is not open to a dialogue- for it is dialogue that is at the core of any educational institution.

THE CHINESE DRUG FIRM PRODUCING POWDER FOR USE IN THE MANUFACTURE OF THE RU-486 IS DEEMED UNSAFE--AND SEARLE PHARMACEUTICAL ISSUES A DISCLAIMER FOR ITS PROSTAGLANDIN-CYTOTEC.

The Health and Science column appearing on Page 4 of this issue of LIFE NEWS explains in detail the information you will need to write immediately to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to state your objection to the use of RU-486 and Cytotec.

The U.S. Company, Searle Pharmaceutical, on 8/23/00 issued to all Health Care Providers a disclaimer prohibiting use of their prostaglandin, Cytotec, in conjunction with RU-486. Searle states that, "it has become aware of some instances where Cytotec, outside of its approved indication, was used as a cervical ripening agent prior to termination of pregnancy, or for induction of labor, in spite of the specific contraindications to its use during pregnancy".

Searle continues, "Serious adverse events reported following off-label use of Cytotec in pregnant women include maternal and fetal death; uterine rupture or perforations, hysterectomy, amniotic fluid embolism, severe vaginal bleeding, retained placenta, shock, fetal bradycardia and pelvic pain." HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT

WE REVISIT RU-486 CHEMICAL ABORTIONS

Shortly after we had submitted our December article on RU-486, the media announced that RU-486, also known as Mifepristone, was to be available on Long Island, and Planned Parenthood (PP) would be among those participating. PP was very involved in the clinical trials of RU-486 in the US.

Right to Life Educational Foundation, Inc. (Cincinnati) reports: "During the US clinical trials on RU-486, women who had one of the following conditions or diseases were prohibited from taking the drug: ectopic (tubal) pregnancies, under 18 years of age, more than 35 years of age, smoked over 10 cigarettes a day, liver disease, respiratory disease, kidney disease, adrenal disease, cardiovascular disease, blood clots, hypertension (high blood pressure), anemia, insulindependent diabetes, known allergy to prostaglandins (Cytotec), using an intrauterine device (IUD), long term cortisone therapy, masses or cysts in female organs, infection in female organs, signs that she might abort spontaneously." This list contains 19 medical problems for which women would not be able to have the RU-486 abortion in the clinical trials. "These patient precautions have been observed for its (RU-486) use in France." With the above in mind, give special attention to a release by the US Dept of Health and Human Services that included the drug's labeling warnings that listed the contraindications for use of Mifepristone by women who had the following conditions: "confirmed or suspected ectopic (tubal) pregnancies, intrauterine device (IUD) in place, chronic failure of the adrenal glands, current long term therapy with corticosteroids, history of allergy to Mifepristone, misoprostol or other prostaglandins, and bleeding disorders or current anticoagulant (blood-thinning) therapy." That leaves 11 of the medical conditions that eliminated women from the trials not included in its warning contraindications!

859 women aged 18-45 were included in the US clinical trials. The mean age was 27. The two French clinical trials included 1800 women. "In France, any clinic that uses RU-486 is required to have emergency resuscitation equipment readily available. This includes EKG, I.V. fluids and medicine, and a defibrillator. The US FDA will not require any of this. Add to this the letter from G.D. Searle, the drug company that manufactures Cytotec (misoprostol), that they do not want their drug used for abortion and that they have not and will not conduct research for its use for cervical ripening prior to termination of pregnancy or for induction of labor nor will they support these uses.

Jane E. Henney, M.D., Commissioner of Food and Drugs said, "The approval of mifepristone is the result of the FDA's careful evaluation of the scientific evidence related to the safe and effective use of this drug. The FDA's review and approval of this drug has adhered strictly to our legal mandate and mission as a science-based public health regulatory agency." They have to be kidding!!!

A letter from the FDA's Center for Drug Evaluation and Research to the Population Council in New York dated 9/28/00 stated, "as of April 1, 1999, all applications for new ingredients, new dosage forms, new dosing regimens are required to contain an assessment of the safety and effectiveness of the product in pediatric patients unless this requirement is waived or deferred. We are waiving the pediatric study requirement for this action on this application." Is this an example of "accelerating approval"? Now take into consideration a response by the FDA on age restrictions for use of Mifepristone. "State law determines whether there are any restrictions on minors obtaining surgical or medical abortions. FDA has not set any separate age restriction on the provision of Mifepristone, states may set age restrictions on termination of pregnancy if they believe such restrictions are appropriate."

RTL Educational Foundation reports that the Hua Lian Pharmaceutical Company will make the raw powder in China for the mifepristone drug, trade named Mifeprex. The raw powder will be shipped to the US to be pressed into pills probably at Danco Laboratories, the N.Y. distributor of Mifeprex. Representative Chris Smith (R-NJ) stated, "The company that produces baby poison for enforced abortion in China will now be producing it for American women, and the Chinese government will make money killing unborn American children...This is an outrage...There is a dark motive denying women injured by this dangerous chemical, of available means of suing for recompense for their pain and suffering." If the drug were made in the US, and a woman was injured by it, she could sue. Can you enter an effective lawsuit in China? Not possible!

"In addition, the US company that now has the FDA license to market RU-486 is incorporated offshore in the Cayman Islands. This will make it almost prohibitively expensive to enter a lawsuit for damages if she is injured or the baby is deformed."

The Chinese company, according to US FDA records, has been in court for "false and misleading labeling...samples of another product, Composite Tegafuri, were found to be tainted...high contamination in hundreds of similar products made at this plant...the product was contaminated with fluorouracil, a cellular poison used to combat cancer. The company has falsified FDA documents." Yet, with all this, the FDA has certified this company as meeting US standards???

Douglas Johnson of National Right to Life said, "The Clinton/Gore administration is willing to place women in jeopardy in order to win short term political points from proabortion special groups."

This abortion procedure was touted as being easy, safe, and more secret. This procedure takes several days. All the guidelines warn of heavy bleeding. There are no signs as to when the baby will be expelled. A Detroit newspaper, the *Times Herald* (9/30/00), reported on an interview with Renee Chelian, Executive Director of Northland Family Planning Centers, which comprise 3 Detroit abortion facilities. She said, "We'll tell the women to carry a zip-lock baggie and a Dixie cup wherever they go so they can fish it out of the toilet and look to see if they've passed an embryo." This may have a greater emotional impact than a surgical abortion!

COLLEGE OUTREACH-NEWSPAPER ADVERTISING

According to Feminists For Life (FFL), one out of every five abortions in the U.S. is committed on a college woman. FFL also reports that a 1996 Gallup poll showed that 47% of women with a high school education are prolife, but only 24% of women who have completed a four-year college program consider themselves prolife. Planned Parenthood and its pro-abortion colleagues have a multi-million dollar ad campaign selling abortions to college age women. It is imperative that college students receive prolife information and support YOU CAN **HELP MAKE THAT HAPPEN!**

Please consider funding prolife ads in college newspapers. These ads can be simple classifieds or large display ads. The LICL has ad copy; ads are also available from FFL and other prolife organizations. (It is suggested that ads with a local prolife resource phone number be approved by that organization before publication.) Remember, colleges begin Spring semester in late January and final newspaper issues may be in early May. Time is of the essence to reach current students.

How to Place an Ad

>> Contact the college newspaper office (this may take several tries-students do not work F/T)

>> Ask for a rate card-this will provide costs, ad sizes, publication dates, deadlines, discounts for multiple ads (for faster service, have it faxed or check online)

>> Prepare your ad as you would like it printed

>> Prior discussion of ad content with the newspaper staff is suggested because some colleges reject prolife ads, either entirely or certain content (submitting the ad before payment avoids wasted time and voided checks). Work with the staff to develop an acceptable and informative ad.

>> After placing the ad, request a tearsheet or copy of the newspaper in which the ad ran-you must confirm you got what you paid for.

>> Call the LICL if you have problems or questions with placing ads. Our experience may be helpful.

>> Please let the LICL know of your success/failure with ads. We are interested in tracking which colleges still need ad sponsors and which colleges accept/reject ads.

It is hoped that you will build a relationship with the newspaper so that ad placement becomes an ongoing annual project.

Advertising Inserts

While working with the college newspaper staff, consider approaching them about accepting a prolife advertising supplement. Several good 8-12 page inserts are available. This is a costly project, but these inserts contain much information that most students are unlikely to know, yet most likely to need. Anthony's newspaper, The Revolution, made this claim: "When a woman destroys the life of her unborn child, it is a sign that, by education or circumstances, she has been greatly wronged." Another leading feminist, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, said this about abortion: "When we consider that women are treated as property, it is degrading to women that we should treat our children as property to be disposed of as we wish." Early feminists such as Susan Anthony would have been appalled and angered to think that abortion-which they deplored as the killing of innocent children-would one day be linked in people's minds with the cause of women's rights! ~ Randy Alcorn
