Dear Defender of Life,

Karen Pearl, president and chief executive of Planned Parenthood (PP) of Nassau County, responding to a prayer vigil outside Massapequa PP, was quoted in the November 11th Newsday as saying, "With Americans on edge after the attacks [of September 11th], we feel that it is egregious to do anything further to harass women." This coming from a spokesperson for a branch of the organization whose Manhattan affiliate offered free abortions as its way of recognizing the World Trade Center disaster. I can't find words to adequately describe the callousness and duplicity in PP's words and actions. Abortion itself is an egregious harassment of women and PP is the main aborter of American women.

While sensible and sensitive people tread very lightly when comparing the tragedies of September 11th with other threats to humanity, PP and its ilk have jumped right in, attempting to equate the horrors of September 11th with the trivial inconveniences posed by peaceful, prayerful pro-life witness outside their killing establishments. Again, words escape me.

If any lesson is to be learned from September 11th it is that life is fragile and irreplaceable. It must be cherished, nurtured, protected. We have gone to war to protect us from further terrorism. We must also continue, with greater vigor than ever, our home-front battle of protecting innocent human life in the womb. The signs seem to be pointing to a change in direction for our country. There seems to be more caring and concern for others and less emphasis on self. I would like to believe that the time is ripe for a corresponding increase in protectiveness for pre-born human life and a concomitant desire to help mothers keep and nurture their babies.

Each of us is living in a new reality. We continue about our daily lives which may appear the same but really are not, because the images and losses of September 11th will linger for as long as we live. But a reality which is unchanged is that pre-born babies continue to die by the thousands each day. Hence our work must also continue, hoping that it will be successful in the changed atmosphere of caring. So, another unchanged reality is that we need your continued help to keep the defense of innocent human life in the forefront. Though I'm sure that you have donated to one of the many relief funds established to help families of victims of the terrorism of September 11th, please don't forget to send an end-of-year contribution to your Long Island Coalition for Life. With your help, another new reality—growing out of tragedy—may be that pre-born babies will cease to be victims.

Thank you for your generosity in 2001 which allowed us to accomplish the work detailed on page 8. With your continued support we will persevere and hope to do even more in 2002. Please keep our work in your prayers.

NEW YORK STATE



During the next few weeks Governor Pataki will decide what issues he will include in his January 2nd State of the State Address. Since the Governor will be up for reelection in November 2002 this is a good time to call or write. Form letters have less impact than letters which are individually created. Instead of copying the long sample letter below I suggest that you use parts of it and send a letter which is not identical to it. If time permits please send a similar letter to Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno and your own State Senator. Calls are also important.

Action--Write or Call:

Dear Governor Pataki:

As you decide what issues should take priority in the year 2002 we urge you to include on your agenda the passage of the Unborn Victims of Violence Act (S.57-B/A.6681-A), the Family Protection Act (S. 4836) and similar legislation. We also ask you to enforce New York State Social Service Law 365A which states that only "medically necessary" abortions qualify for Medicaid reimbursement. The State's unsupervised reimbursement policy illegally forces State and County taxpayers to fund the full cost of 38.2% of the abortions in our state, since our "abortion on demand" policy makes our state ineligible for federal funds. Why are we cutting so many programs needed by the poor while using so many millions of Medicaid dollars to kill the unborn?

Considering how successful organizations such as the National Abortion Rights Action League and Planned Parenthood are in opposing any restriction on abortion we realize that it will take courage and persistence for you to come out in favor of such legislation. However, in doing so you will be supporting the wishes of over 60% of the voters who believe:

--that to make a real choice women need to be provided information as to the nature of the

choice, the alternatives and possibly short and long term effects of an abortion;

--that a teenager should not be brought to an abortion clinic without the knowledge of her parents;

-- that their taxes should not fund abortion.

In spite of this young teenagers in our State are often issued a Medicaid card specifically for an abortion without the knowledge of the parent. In fact half of the 10,345 abortions performed on teenagers under 18 years old are Medicaid funded.

There is an urgent need for your support. The last bill restricting abortion, a parental consent bill, was passed by the state legislature 25 years ago. (Even that bill did not become law because of a Governor's veto.) Passage of such laws in other states have resulted in a large decrease in the number of abortions. The rate of abortion in New York State is higher than that of any other state except for California. Will you help change this? Please respond. Thank you.

HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT PTSD, PAS AND PASS



After many years of legalized abortion (Supreme Court decisions in 1973), "the Pandora's box is now opened, and all the myths regarding 'health', 'freedom' and 'choice' are flying out. Abortion continues to take violently the lives of countless unborn children, and now more and more people are seeing how it has sucked the life out of the child's parents, grandparents and siblings; in fact the entire family unit can be affected." Fr. John J. Dillon, author of "A Path to Hope" and spokesperson for Project Rachel (healing and reconciling ministry) for the Diocese of Rockville Centre, Long Island, NY, goes on to say, "Abortion is no longer seen as liberation; rather it has become a major source of inner enslavement for vast numbers of women and men who so often suffer, for years, in silence."

Drs. Philip G. Ney and Marie Peeters-Ney write, "There are approximately 60 million abortions each year worldwide. In some Eastern European countries 90% of women have had abortions, often 7 or 8 per woman. In China...all pregnancies save one are terminated...In the US approximately 70% of women have had an abortion by the time they are 45, and another 10 - 15% have contemplated abortion...approximately 1 in 3 North American pregnancies end in abortion."

In the past we have listed the physical complications a woman may encounter following an abortion. Later in this article we will list some of the emotional symptoms suffered by not only the woman, but also the baby's father, and in some cases the abortion victim's siblings. These symptoms are recognized as being closely related to Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) occurs "when a person undergoes a traumatic experience which is beyond their normal ability to 'cope' and results in intense fear, feelings of helplessness or being trapped, or loss of control," explains David Reardon, PhD. Many women experience these same symptoms after having an abortion. This trauma is called Post-Abortion Syndrome (PAS). Wanda Franz, PhD states: "Every woman who has an abortion must deal with the death of her unborn child as a social, emotional, intellectual and spiritual reality." There is a tremendous list of post-abortion symptoms. Fr. John J. Dillon and The Life Center of Deer Park, NY have written about the following: anxiety, grief, depression, low self-esteem, shame, flashbacks, guilt, suicidal thoughts, anger, nightmares or sleep anxiety, feelings of helpless ness and betrayal, rejection, hatred, failure, fear, phobias and compulsive disorders, fear of other children, fixating on another child, abuse of another child, alienation and loss of trust in others, sexual promiscuity, impatience and relational instability. There are also physical illnesses of a psychosomatic nature: high blood pressure, ulcers, panic attacks, violent behavior, insomnia, substance abuse and sexual dysfunction. The repercussions often arise as a delayed reaction occurring about 5 years after the abortion.

Dr. Vincent Rue, PhD writes, "We've only begun to recognize the profound price paid in the aftermath of abortion, and its lasting impact on the women, their families and on society. In the act and aftermath of abortion, it behooves us to finally recognize the profound price paid."

A Los Angeles Times poll among 1,050 men showed 7% of the men acknowledged having been the father of an aborted child. Guilt was felt by almost 2/3 of the men and regret by more than 1/3. When the father or siblings experience the aforementioned symptoms, it is referred to as Post-Abortion Survivor Syndrome (PASS).

Dr. Vincent Rue, PhD refers to an article written by Arthur Shostak, Sociologist for The Family Coordinator, that 3 out of 4 males involved in an abortion study said "they had a difficult time with the abortion experience and that a sizable minority reported persistent day and night dreams about the child that never was, and con siderable guilt, remorse and sadness." He explains the double standard regarding abortion: "While the right to abdicate future mother hood is guaranteed, the right to insist on future fatherhood is not. If women choose motherhood, men are obligated in paternity action, while women may choose an abortion over the males' objection..."

Drs. Philip G. Ney and Marie Peeters-Ney have spent many years researching, giving talks, teaching and writing on "Abortion Survivors" (the title of one of their books). They describe Post Abortion Survival Syndrome (PASS) symptoms, those suffered by people when they know they could have been terminated. The doctors describe in detail at least 10 different types of abortion survivors: "Their situations and conflicts are different, but they have in common deep questions about whether they should be alive, whether they are worth anything to anybody, and whether they should develop their abilities..."

Space will not allow us to summarize all 10 types, but we would like to mention a few: Statistical Survivors are those who survived in countries or cities where there is a statistically higher probability they could have been aborted (check again the statistics in the beginning of this article and consider the following - approximately 1.6 million abortions annually in our country-4,356 daily-about one abortion ever 20 seconds). Threatened Survivors are those who may have been told in anger, "I could have aborted you!" Ambivalent Survivors are those whose parents' contemplated abortion and are told at a later time. It seems impossible to believe this occurs, but a frustrated mother did say to her teenage daughter in front of one of us, "I would have aborted her if it was legal when I was pregnant!" Imagine the suffering following such a statement. It was a devastating experience! A Twin Survivor is the child who survives when the abortionist misses locating and aborting a twin, The surviving twin often grieves and feels a great deal of anger. There is always "It could have been me!" Consider the number of late term "pregnancy reductions" following fertility treatments. Disabled Survivors are close to our hearts. These children are born with birth defects that were not identified in utero. Many lawsuits have been filed against doctors for not identifying diseases/defects before birth. We recall what a Down Syndrome patient said following Dr. Jerome Lejeune's death, "Who will protect us now?"

Dr. Philip Ney told us, "There is no scientific basis for the practice of abortion, not therapeutically or for safety. 95% of abortions are done for mental health reasons. Abortions are contraindicated psychologically. Some day there will be a class action suit. Abortionists will be sued as women are being hurt."

Fr. Dillon presents a charitable challenge to all of us to understand and open our hearts: "Every human being no matter what the manner of conception, is a dwelling place for God's Spiritof life. From conception that human being is unique, irreplaceable and sacred. Project Rachel, and programs like it, go beyond this basic pro-life premise and state that the sacredness of the lives of those who aborted must also be maintained. They, too, are precious and irreplaceable in the Lord's eyes even though they might not believe it...Clearly, the traumatic impact of abortion is wide and deep... Tragically, the unborn child was not the only one to die on the abortionist's table."



Polls Show Big Increase in Those Identifying Themselves As

A Gallup poll taken in August 2001 showed that as many people identified themselves as pro-life as they did "pro-choice." Both were 46%. By contrast, only 33% named themselves pro-life in Gallup's 1995 poll, while 56% called themselves "pro-choice" that year. Thus what was a 23% margin of "pro-choice" over pro-life six years ago has been reduced to a margin of zero.

In June of this year, the Polling Company found that 39% identified themselves as pro-life and 46% as "pro-choice".

Free-lance writer Joel Mowbray in a column in the Washington Times (8/24/01), commented: "Primarily because of the nationwide debate over *partial-birth abortion*, support for abortion rights has declined substantially since 1995..."

The Polling Company in a recent survey found that only 16% of Americans believe that abortion should be allowed for any reason after the first trimester.



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

QUESTION: "The unborn is an embryo or a fetus-just a simple blob of tissue, a product of conception-not a baby. Abortion is terminating a pregnancy, not killing a child."

ANSWER: Like toddler and adolescent, the terms embryo and fetus do not refer to nonhumans, but to humans at particular stages of development.

The word embryo is used of any living creature at an early stage of development. Fetus is a Latin word meaning "young one" or "little child."

It is scientifically inaccurate to say an embryo or a fetus is not a human being simply because he is at an earlier stage of development than a born infant. This is like saying that a toddler is not a human being-or is less of a human being-because he is not yet an adolescent. Or, that an adolescent is not a human being because he is not yet an adult.
