Planned Parenthood Alert

It appears Planned Parenthood will not hold a Teen Health Conference in the spring of 2005. Instead, they are planning a conference in the spring of 2005 for professionals and educators. Planned Parenthood has been promoting Comprehensive Sex Education in the public schools and they are seeking state funding to implement their "safer sex" agenda. The National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, National Institute of Health, Department of Health and Human Services Workshop Summary: Scientific Evidence on Condom Effectiveness for Sexually Transmitted Disease Prevention, July 20, 2001 concluded that while male latex condoms could reduce the transmission of HIV/

AIDs, "there was not enough evidence to determine that they were effective in reducing the risk of most other sexually transmitted diseases." Yet Planned Parenthood persists in perpetuating an agenda which is costly to human life. Planned Parenthood, if they cannot have direct access to our teens via a Teen Health Conference, will gain access by promoting their message to educators and professionals who do have access to our teens.

Parents must become involved to prevent this intrusion and demand that schools comply with the Commissioner's Regulations 135.

Embryonic Stem Cell Research Pledge/Petition

The following was taken from a letter sent to LICL from Dr. Dan Forcasiu. Dan is involved with the pro-life group at St. Hyacinth Catholic Church, Glen Head, NY. He wishes to alert everyone to the dangers inherent in embryonic stem cell research.

In the January 2004 issue of LIFE NEWS, Dolores Andreski (RIP) and Regina Carbonaro had researched the cloning issue with an emphasis on the correct definition of the terms stating: "Supporters of cloning argue that a human being only exists in reproductive cloning when the embryo is implanted in the womb." Debi Vinnedge (ALL Celebrate Life Nov/Dec 2003) writes, "Location, location, location! Since when does it matter where the new embryo is produced? Thousands of babies have been born using in-vitro fertilization, who were most certainly produced outside the womb, yet political pundits would like you to believe they are not 'embryos' at all, only 'pre-embryos' or 'non-persons.' These words are used so often in scientific circles and the pro-abortion world that most people believe these are valid scientific terms for early embryos."

Dr. Forcasiu stated "a scientist raised and living in an amoral or even morally neutral society (that is, which

understands the exigencies of morality but does not enforce them) does not normally pose moral questions to himself. Thus, when a team of Japanese and U.S. researchers working at the University of Utah transplanted human ovaries to mice, the French gene specialist Louis-Marie Houdebine hailed the work as "brilliant." He noted though that preliminary research on animals would answer questions of the transplanting technique and genetic damage among their offspring, and that going directly to human ovaries could suggest that the researchers "are in a hurry to get there first", (Yahoo News on Asia, 3/07/00—9:29 AM). Being there first obliterates any other considerations.

In light of the above, Dr. Forcasiu has come up with a pledge he hopes everyone will sign. It reads in part, "Never, under any circumstances, will I accept any medicine, drug, remedy, or treatment whose creation, development or research sacrificed a human life, particularly the unborn. This pledge shall also be binding on any guardian who might be in charge of my care in case of enfeeblement of body mind or spirit."

He has also written a petition to help get laws enacted for labeling and identifying medicines and products developed from stem cell research. For more information you can e-mail Dr. Forcasiu at dfarca@aol.com.

FEDERAL LEGISLATION

In the recent national elections, which saw the largest voter turnout in American history, President George W. Bush received a

history, President George W. Bush received a 3.5 million vote margin of victory over his opponent pro-abortion Senator John Kerry of Mass. The pro-life movement needed this victory very badly. The consequence of a Kerry victory would have erased all the vital pro-life legislation that had been passed during President Bush's first term. Added to the Presidential victory was the election of seven new pro-life U.S. Senators. Twenty of the thirty-eight newly elected Congressman are pro-life.

These election achievements will certainly release pro-life legislation that U.S. Senator Tom Daschle, (D. ND) had prevented from reaching the Senate floor for a vote. Surprisingly, pro-abortion Daschle was defeated in this election by pro-life Senator-elect John Thune.

Some of the bills, long delayed, which should see swift passage are:

The Child Custody Protection Act making it a federal crime to take a minor over state lines for a secret abortion in violation of a parents right to be notified.

The Ban on Human Cloning sponsored by Senators Landrieu and Brownback. This had passed in the House by a 241-155 vote. Cloning always kills a human embryo while the process uses a woman as laboratory equipment, as incubator or field for growing and harvesting body parts.

The Unborn Child Pain Awareness Act. This bill requires that a woman seeking an abortion after 20 weeks gestation must be informed by the abortionist regarding the capacity of the unborn child to experience great pain during its abortion, In addition, the abortionist would be required to provide the woman with a consent form in which she could refuse or accept the administration of a pain relieving drug for her unborn child during the abortion.

Action: Please contact Your Senator and Congressional Member urging they support the three bills. These bills will eventually be assigned new numbers in the 109th Congress (2005-2006).

Good News: On 12/08/04 President Bush signed the \$388-billion Fiscal Budget Bill (10/1/04-10/01/05). The bill included a provision that would block any of the money from going to federal, state, or local agencies that act against health care providers and insurers because they don't do abortions, make abortion referrals or cover them. This provision constitutes a fundamental step in the pro-life direction.

NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATION

The 2005-2006 N.Y.S. Legislative Session is scheduled to begin 1/05. All bills which have not become law in the



2003-2004 Session will die unless they are reintroduced. As a result of intensive pro-life lobbying (your letters and phone calls included) bills allowing dispensing of emergency contraception without a patient specific prescription and bills allowing cloning and embryonic stem cell research did not pass the State Senate in 2004. It is almost a certainty that these bills will be introduced again in 2005. We will continue to lobby against these bills and will also lobby for restriction on taxpayer funding of abortion and for legislation, such as the Family Protection Act, which would require informed consent (women's "right to know") and parental consent before a minor is given an abortion.



HEALTH & SCIENCE REPORT THE STEM CELL DEBATE

The "first cell" of life is totipotent – able to generate every other cell of the body. As this cell divides, it creates the embryonic layers (ectoderm, mesoderm and endoderm). The ectoderm layer specializes in neurons and supporting cells (glia). Stem cells in the mesoderm develop into red and white blood cells, platelets and also bone, muscle, fat, cartilage and skin. The stem cells of the endoderm develop into cells for the digestive system and the lungs. Everyone has stem cells. Our bodies are constantly making new ones. The three sources of human stem cells are: a) embryonic stem cells taken from aborted babies, "leftover" IVF embryos, or cloning; b) umbilical cord blood taken from the newborn child; c) adult stem cells taken from an individual's tissues such as bone marrow, fat or blood and later grown in tissue culture.

Using embryonic stem cells ALWAYS requires the destruction of the embryo in order to harvest its stem cells. One problem in using embryonic stem cells is that they can become contaminated with blood and tissue cells with ABO and HLA antigens on their surfaces. This can cause Graft Versus Host reactions, thus causing health problems in the patient. Immunosuppressant drugs can be toxic to neural stem cells and therefore may decrease success when treating neurological cases. Some embryonic stem cell lines that have been approved for research are no longer "pure". Mouse feeder cells were introduced to keep them viable. Time and proliferation both affect the potency of these stem cells.

The FDA approved the use of umbilical cord blood in the 1980's. In 1988, the first umbilical cord blood transfusion cured a blood cancer. Cord blood stem cells have been used to treat children with leukemia resulting in very few side effects. Host Versus Graft reactions have not been a problem. These stem cells have no HLA or ABO antigens due to advances in separating the cells from other blood components. 300,000 stem cells can be obtained from a normal placenta and umbilical cord. The use of these cells can or will soon help heart patients, Parkinson's patients, cancer patients, stroke and brain injuries, cognitive disorders and Alzheimer's disease, retinal damage, genetic disorders and mutations, burn and radiation patients.

When there is an injury, blood vessels are damaged and narrow. The tissue is hypoxic – lacking oxygen. Stem cells thrive in this environment. They are stimulated to grow and develop into cells similar to the ones around them. As they grow and specialize, they can be changed into whatever cells are needed by the patient. The collection codes of the American Association of Blood Banks ensure that transmittable infections will be prevented. Embryonic stem cells are of unknown origin and viability, leading to a higher risk of genetic mutations and tumors. Umbilical cord stem cells are only utilized if the baby is healthy and the blood tests and cell cultures are normal. The risk of Graft

Versus Host reaction is minimal and powerful immunosuppressant drugs are not required.

The Whitehead Institute issued a report that showed why there are so many problems with embryonic stem cells and cloning. Mice were cloned using mouse embryonic stem cells. There were significant instabilities and variations in how genes turned on and off in the mice. The starting embryonic stem cells were unstable. Supporters of human embryonic stem cell research claim they will be able to form any of the 210 tissues in the human body. To date, there has been very little success - usually tumors or partially formed tissue occur. Culturing embryonic stem cells affects their totipotency and can lead to fetal abnormalities. Even with identical growth factor conditions there is significant culture to culture variability. It is difficult to obtain a specific single cell type. Poor availability of human oocytes, low efficiency with the nuclear transfer procedure and the length of time needed to double human embryonic stem cells make cloning as a routine clinical procedure appear unlikely. Current research shows that producing pure populations of needed cell types is not easy. This would be necessary for safe and reliable cell therapies or organ replacements. Just keeping embryonic stem cells alive is challenging.

Researchers at Genron Corp. injected undifferentiated human embryonic stem cells into rats' brains. The cells did not differentiate. They stayed in a disorganized cluster and the cells around them began to die. Embryonic stem cells injected into mouse knee joints formed teratomas and destroyed the joints.


Adult stem cells taken from bone marrow can repair blood cells, the immune system, heart muscle and neurological damage. A pilot study has shown that umbilical cord stem cells can be effective in treating children with Cerebral Palsy. After two decades of work, embryonic stem cell research has not cured a single patient. Adult stem cell research has already produced 140 treatments for diseases and ailments.

"The risks of cancer, uncontrollable growth, genome instability and other hurdles make ES cells a bad investment in terms of finance as well as health benefits... adult stem cells are more likely to generate affordable therapies that can benefit everyone...it's far from certain that cloning can do what it's supposed to do, i.e. avoid rejection. Yet, many in Science advocate that we travel this convoluted path when we clearly have safer, less problematic and already proven alternatives...Scientists should stop manipulating public opinion to promote research that's both morally and scientifically indefensible. At the same time, governments need to invest our tax money in scientific research that can genuinely benefit the health of the nation, and not be misled by false promises of the next economic boom." (From a recent Statement by the Institute of Science in Society)
