"Equality Amendment"?

WHAT THE MEDIA DOESN'T WANT YOU TO KNOW ABOUT THE "EQUALITY AMENDMENT"

In November 2024 a proposed state constitutional amendment will be on the ballot for voter approval. This proposed state constitutional amendment will create a state constitutional right to "REPRODUCTIVE HEALTHCARE AND AUTONOMY" for "PERSONS." Notably absent from its text are the words and phrases "EXCEPTION," "MINOR," "PARENT," "CONSCIENCE," "EXEMPTION," and "LATE TERM."

This "Equality Amendment" (S.108A) is in reality an "Inequality Amendment." If approved by the voters, it will empower unaccountable state judges and bureaucrats to:

One, DISCRIMINATE against pro-life health care workers, social workers and educators by denying them licenses if they refuse to do abortion referrals. IF YOU DEFINE "CHRISTIAN" AS A PERSON WHO REFUSES TO DO ABORTION REFERRALS THEN PASSAGE OF THE "EQUALITY AMENDMENT" WILL MEAN NO MORE CHRISTIAN NURSES AND DOCTORS IN NEW YORK.

Two, **DISCRIMINATE** against pro-life parents by denying parents the right to require their consent for their minor age daughters being given an abortion as opposed to parents who object to their minor age daughters being given an aspirin.

Three, **DISCRIMINATE** against babies by denying their right to life through sanctioning their killing by abortion, including painful *late-term* and *partial-birth* abortion, and by infanticide through intentional neglect if the unfortunate baby is *born alive* after an attempted abortion.

Four, **DISCRIMINATE** in favor of abortionists by awarding abortionists the **PRIVILEGE** of operating without the health and safety regulations lifesaving surgeons and pharmacists must adhere to.

Please vote against the "Equality Amendment" in 2024.

Pro-Lifers Arrested

On October 22, 2020, 10 pro-life rescuers were arrested at the Washington DC Surgi-Center, run by late-term abortionist Cesare Santangelo. On August 29, 2023 five of the pro-lifers were found guilty on all counts of violating the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act plus conspiracy to violate rights. They were immediately taken into custody by Federal Marshals to await sentencing. Judge Colleen Kollar-Kotelly cited their conviction for a 'crime of violence' when ordering the 5 defendants to be detained immediately following the verdict. The maximum sentence is 11 years in jail, with a \$350,000 fine. During the trial, the judge told the jury the trial was not about whether abortion is just or unjust, it's about whether clinics have a right to operate. The judge also informed the attorneys that they could not use certain words such as "infanticide, abortion, or innocent lives." One of the lawyers for the defendants stated, "These prolife advocates committed no violence during their protest at the abortion facility as they kneeled and prayed, distributed pro-life literature, and counseled women considering abortions. The real violence is what happens to an innocent child during an abortion procedure." The trials for 4 other pro-lifers began Sept. 6. Please pray for these courageous individuals.

SYNTHETIC EMBRYOS: Because they are very flexible, embryonic stem cells are appealing to researchers. Various cell types are made from them, and researchers are always looking for ways to use them to treat disease. However, embryonic stem cells are obtained by destroying human embryos. Until now, it has not been possible to "rewind" an embryonic stem cell to make an embryo. Researchers from Cambridge and Israel announced that they created synthetic embryos without using sperm or egg by manipulating embryonic stem cells – with genetic reprogramming and mixing different cell types together. The researchers claim this could help "unlock the mysteries of very early development and address early pregnancy loss." Bioethicist Fr. Tad Pacholczyk questions, "Are these so-called 'synthetic embryos' really living human embryos? If they are, we have walked right into the ethical landmine of creating human beings [from an unethical source solely to be exploited for research or experimental purposes. If they are not, can that line be crossed through additional steps to make them authentic human embryos? Scientists are likely to continue to improve their techniques so as to generate better embryo stand-ins, enabling them to study in ever greater detail the way that early human development unfolds." According to Developmental Biologist Alfonso Martinez Arias, the Cambridge embryo 'models' were not 'real' embryos, but "masses of cells separated into compartments." However, the models created at the Weizmann Institute in Israel grew for up to two weeks and "exhibited characteristics quite similar to regular embryos." Some argue that if these embryos were implanted, they would "fail to initiate a pregnancy, and this proves they aren't a real embryo." However, Fr. Tad noted that not all pregnancies are successful. Miscarriages occur not because the child "was not an embryo, but because the child was affected by a genetic or developmental defect. Could these newly produced synthetic embryos be real embryos that have a defect thanks to the various laboratory manipulations they have undergone?" He goes on to note that the various terms – embryo structures, synthetic embryos, stem cell embryo models, and 'stembryos' – may be used to "go around ethics by relying on euphemism." FEDERAL LEGISLATION

As of Sept. 5, neither the *NDAA* bill nor the *Agriculture, FDA, etc.* bill is near passage. Both bills involve abortion policy (see LN, Sep. '23, p. 3). Only the House's *FDA* bill bans mailing *mifepristone*. On Aug. 16, the 5th Circuit Court ruled in *Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine v FDA* that the drug was wrongly approved and shall not be mailed. But

mifepristone can still be sold, since SCOTUS ruled (April 21) the drug can remain on sale as other suits against it move up through the Courts. The 5^{th} Circuit ruling may impact the House's FDA bill.

- The Pregnant Workers Fairness Act says employers with over 15 employees must "reasonably accommodate" a worker's "pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions." The *E.E.O.C.* now wants 'related medical conditions' to include abortions. - In 2000, SCOTUS okayed 'bubble zones' in *Hill v Colorado*. Attorneys General from 14 states have asked the Court to overturn the case.
- Aug. 15: DC Circuit Court called it "quintessential view-point discrimination" that 2 pro-lifers were arrested for chalking "black pre-born lives matter" in 2021, vs. just 4 arrests for defacement during 2 months of DC BLM riots.
- On Dec. 31, after nearly 30 years, PA will stop funding *Real Alternatives*, which sends funding on to PRC's and maternity homes. Gov. Shapiro "will ensure women in (PA get) the reproductive health care they deserve."
- On Aug. 8, Ohio voters voted down (57%-43%), a bill backed by pro-lifers to make amending the Ohio Constitution

harder. In Nov. they will vote on adding a Constitutional Amendment to "make and carry out reproductive decisions" ...that aren't "limited to" abortion. On Aug. 24, the Ohio Ballot Board okayed rewording the Amendment. 'Fetus' became 'Unborn child', and it was made clearer an attending doctor can decide to perform a post-viability abortion. Proabortionists call the changes "propaganda."



NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATION

The New York State Legislature will begin its next session in January 2024. Since Roe v. Wade was reversed by the U.S. Supreme

Court, some states have been moving to codify abortion rights in their own jurisdictions. Pro-abortion forces in New York are proposing an amendment to Article 1, Section 11 of the NYS Constitution (Assembly bill A01283, Senate bill S00108A). The amendment will appear on the November 2024 ballot. Reading the accompanying memo, the stated purpose is to expand "equal" protection rights to hitherto unlisted groups of persons. It pays lip service to freedom of belief, expression, and religious liberty, but as can be attested by some, action on some of those beliefs can either get you freedom or imprisonment. It all depends on if you are part of the protected class. (See pg. 2) ... "This is our mandate to continue strengthening New York's status as a destination state where reproductive freedoms are protected and the right to choose is guaranteed," Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins said at a news conference before the vote.

HEALTH & SCIENCE "Dead Enough"?



Alexandra Snyder reported in the Summer 2023 edition of LifeLine, a publication of the Life Legal Defense Foundation, on the proposed changes to the definition of death by the Uniform Law Commission (ULC). After receiving requests from neurologists, the ULC proposed that the word "irreversible" should be replaced with "permanent" in the definition of death. She explained, "At first glance, this may appear to be a distinction without a difference. However, a person with an irreversible brain injury, by definition, will never recover any brain function. A permanent loss of brain function, on the other hand, only exists until the patient dies. If someone's life support is removed because of a brain injury, the loss of brain function is permanent. That does not mean the loss of brain function was irreversible." These proposed changes would also apply to cardiopulmonary death, currently defined as "the irreversible cessation of circulatory and respiratory functions."

Snyder explained how "some patients' organs are harvested in a process called 'controlled donation after circulatory death' (cDCD). This typically occurs when a patient suffers loss of oxygen to the brain that renders him or her incapacitated, but not 'brain dead.' Often these patients are able to breathe on their own, but require nutrition and hydration through a feeding tube. Hospitals will impose a "do not resuscitate" (DNR) order and then proceed to withdraw nutrition. The starvation process eventually triggers a cardiac event. Because of the DNR, the patient is not resuscitated, but allowed to 'die naturally.' After the patient has been dead for a prescribed period of time (no longer than 5 minutes), doctors cut off blood flow to the patient's brain and then reanimate the heart. This ensures that the patient meets the criteria for brain death, while allowing the heart and other organs to remain viable for harvesting. Of course, if a person's heart can be restarted after he or she is declared 'dead,' the cessation of circulatory function is not in fact irreversible, and the person does not technically meet the current criteria for death. Their cessation of circulatory and respiratory function is, however, permanent – at least until they are initially declared 'dead.' At that point, the law no longer considers that

individual a patient, but rather a container of body parts."

Snyder stated this is not just an academic discussion. Doctors DO try to harvest organs from people who need them. Life Legal has worked with patients 'on the cDCD tract.' Many were young people who had loss of oxygen after a heart attack or stroke. A 31-year-old woman was placed in hospice – with no nutrition – less than 48 hours after a heart attack. She began to recover and asked for food, but the hospice staff refused saying the doctors had said she would be a 'vegetable.' They were able to get a court order and have nutrition reinstated and she was placed in a rehabilitative program and made an almost complete recovery. Without intervention, she would have been declared dead and have had her organs transplanted into another patient.

Another patient – a 39-year-old woman with Down Syndrome - was declared dead due to 'irreversible cessation of circulatory function'. Doctors started the process of removing organs. The patient's heart suddenly restarted, but because of the DNR, she was given fentanyl, but no other care. She was pronounced dead again 18 minutes after her initial death. An autopsy revealed cause of death to be acute fentanyl toxicity and her death was ruled a homicide.

Snyder noted that many people don't really understand how organs are procured. "Most people on the organ donor registry do not understand that their lives may be cut short – sometimes by decades...individuals on the donor registry are also unaware of the growing global market for human skin and other tissue for purely cosmetic procedures. These parts are harvested by organ procurement companies and then sold to processors and distributors...Potential donors should be informed about the likelihood that their body parts may not be used for life-saving transplants, but rather for beauty products or cosmetic surgery."

Life Legal "strongly opposes revisions to the definition of death under the Uniform Determination of Death Act that would allow for further subjectivity in the determination of death. [They] are advocating for provisions in the Uniform Declaration of Death Act that would require notification and consent for brain death testing and allow patients' decision-makers to opt out of a declaration of death based solely on neurological criteria. And [they] are calling for complete transparency and informed consent regarding organ harvesting, including controlled donation after cardiac death."

Educate yourself before enrolling in the donor registry. It's difficult to remove your name once you sign up. Instead, Life Legal recommends "giving someone you trust the authority to make decisions regarding the disposition of your organs in real time and based on your medical condition and prognosis."
