#### **Governor Cuomo - Abortion**

Calvin Freiburger, reported at LifeSiteNews.com on 8/8/18, "Governor Cuomo has announced a new "public awareness" campaign to promote abortion centers and counter what he calls pro-life "misinformation." The campaign is called "Know Your Options" ... It consists of subway ads encouraging women to visit a state website that proports to help them "get the facts" and connect to "comprehensive family services". The announcement states, "These actions are in direct response to widespread reports of organizations known as Crisis Pregnancy Centers or CPCs misrepresenting themselves as health centers to dissuade those seeking abortion from going through that choice. These reports show that CPCs often use false and misleading advertising and offer free services to attract women into their offices, where they then allegedly misinform and mislead those who seek pregnancy-related information."

Cuomo stated, "While the federal government wages war on women's reproductive rights, New York will fight back to protect women's access to comprehensive, safe and affordable health care. In New York, we refuse to let President Trump and Washington take us backwards and jeopardize the rights of New Yorkers. We are launching this public awareness campaign to combat the insidious spread of misleading, medically inaccurate information about reproductive health and to ensure all New York women know the options they are legally entitled to." On the website, individuals can look up health plans and licensed providers in the state, as well as NY's health programs for low-income women. The website states that in-clinic abortions "are safe, outpatient procedures" and medication abortions involve 'giving you medicine at an office visit and then allowing you to go home with more medicine to end the pregnancy." The website stresses that women should go to "Quality Family Planning Providers" who offer information "without pressure or bias".

Freiburger stated, "Former Planned Parenthood clinic director Abby Johnson responded by noting that leading CPC groups Heartbeat International and Care Net do recommend that CPCs that offer ultrasounds or lab tests employ licensed medical professionals, whereas Planned Parenthood does not require licensing for its own workers performing those functions. Pro-lifers argue that many of these attacks could be more accurately directed at Planned Parenthood and other abortion centers, from lack of options and poor health standards to false information and pressure to choose abortion... Cuomo's abortion advocacy includes permitting abortion effectively until birth, forcing taxpayers and insurance companies to pay for abortion, a largely symbolic push to codify Roe v Wade in state law, and declaring that 'rightto-life' supporters "have no place in the state of New York."

#### **UNICEF** – It's that time of year again

Before donating to UNICEF, please pause to consider the following:

The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) is a UN organization that is, according to its website, "on a mission to reach every child and ensure their well-being, no matter where they live in this world. There's no limit to the lengths UNICEF will go, the risks we'll take or the depth of our commitment to save children's lives. We are committed to take action, save, rehabilitate and watch over children, with special attention to the most vulnerable and excluded groups."

In May 2016, UNICEF Canada pushed for assisted suicide and euthanasia for children, arguing that it conformed with the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. Manitoba Senator Don Plett stated; "[the UN General Assembly mandated UNICEF] to advocate for the protection of children's rights, to help them meet their basic needs, and to expand their opportunities to reach their full potential. Do you not see a major problem with the consideration of allowing vulnerable children to request assisted death? Have these children...reached their full potential?" UNICEF Canada's policy director Marvin Bernstein stated, "Children who are experiencing irremediable conditions, intolerable and enduring suffering... should have the right when they reach a point of sufficient maturity to make some determinations for themselves."

**UNICEF** has called for Legal Abortion in the Dominican Republic, Peru, Nicaragua, the Philippines, and other countries worldwide. In 2007, UNICEF joined Planned Parenthood International and the UN's population control arm UNFPA in sponsoring a women's conference, 1/3 of which was dedicated to promoting abortions. Carol Bellamy was executive director of UNICEF from 1995 until 2005. During her tenure, UNICEF became a more direct force behind the promotion of abortion and abortifacient contraceptives worldwide. UNICEF has called for the right of children to confidential sexual and reproductive health services and information – access to 'safe abortion' and the morning after pill. Susan Yoshihara, Ph.D. writes for the Center for Family & Human Rights (C-FAM) and stated, "UNICEF's former mission of promoting child survival allowed the agency to prioritize such issues, but when it adopted a rights-based approach in 1986, it effectively had to emphasize equally all the rights contained in the Children's convention as well as the Women's convention." Controversy has resulted since then.

In April of this year, protesters picketed UNICEF's office near the UN during the just-completed Commission on the Status of Women, a UN conference where prolifers won a major victory. The complaint against UNICEF is that the UN children's agency joined a global campaign to promote "comprehensive sexuality education" that critics say promotes controversial ideas for children including abortion.

### The ballot box matters!



#### FEDERAL LEGISLATION

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, by a 5-4 vote, the US Supreme Court ruled that Pregnancy Help Centers in California could not be forced to display signs telling women where to get a Statefunded abortion. (NIFLA v. Becerra) Justice

Thomas wrote that the law "unduly burdens protected speech." Justice Kennedy said, "Freedom of speech secures freedom of thought and belief. This law imperils those liberties." NARAL said the Court sided with 'fake health centers that lie to women.' California could try rewriting the law, but the ruling is on broad principles, hard to get around.

Three other cases were argued as Freedom of Speech violations (Masterpiece Cake Shop, Arlene's Flowers, and Janus v AFSCME). Arlene's and Masterpiece were sent back to State Courts. S.P. Richert wrote (crisismagazine.com, 7/10), that the opinion in Masterpiece could serve as a 'how-to' guide for forcing shop owners to provide service. He also noted the trends to view traditional morality as 'hate speech' and to cite Freedom of Religion in fewer Court rulings.

Brett Kavanaugh has been nominated to the Supreme Court. Hearings are expected to begin in September. Pro-abortion forces are gearing up to fight against another 'conservative' justice on the Court. Supporters of Roe v Wade talk of 'settled law', and stare de*cisis* (deferring to Court precedent). While precedent is important for maintaining predictability, the Janus ruling overturned a 40-year precedent. The Supreme Court issues opinions, not laws. In 2006, Kavanaugh told the Senate during his confirmation hearing for the DC Circuit Court, "I would follow *Roe v Wade* faithfully and fully. That would be binding precedent of the court. It's been decided by the Supreme Court...It has been reaffirmed many times..." Last fall, Kavanaugh found that an unaccompanied minor had no 'right' to abortion on demand, without addressing an overall 'abortion right'. In a 2017 speech as a 'private citizen', he endorsed Justice Rehnquist's dissent in Roe v Wade (abortion has too many State restrictions to be considered an 'unenumerated right').

Last year, HHS changed the Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) grant program, to stress sexual risk avoidance. This June, PP and others sued. The Administration wants the judges to toss two of the suits, since PP didn't apply for TPP grants this year. As HHS reviews the 'Protect Life Rule', 96 Title X recipients were announced, including 13 regional PP's. (PP of NY is not included, however there are four NY recipients, including the NYS Dept of Health.)

In June, two Christian colleges received permanent relief from the ObamaCare abortifacient/ sterilization/ contraception mandate by a Federal District Court. The Court also said the mandate violates the Religious Freedom Restoration Act.

News Notes: A Federal judge has blocked an Arkan-

sas law requiring doctors who dispense abortion pills to have admitting privileges or have a partner who does. U of MN pro-abortion students want the University to revive an abortionist training program that pro-life students helped to cancel. Iowa's Supreme Court negated a 72hour waiting period law, while pro-lifers sued to make that state's 'Heartbeat' abortion ban tougher. Proabortionists in Iowa, N. Dakota & MN are filing suits claiming their states' constitutions contain an 'abortion right'. Eight pro-abortionists in Tennessee continue to fight a 2014 ballot measure which passed saying the state's constitution contains no abortion right. SCOTUS may hear the case.

The American Medical Association's new position on **doctor-prescribed suicide** is that they "want to study the matter further". In the past, they have been opposed to it.

In mid-July, the National Abortion Federation dropped 7 of its 11 claims against videographer David **Daleiden**. NAF is hoping to win the case more quickly, thus making the 'gag order' on the videos permanent.

There has been **no congressional action on four** pending pro-life bills. (See LN Jul/Aug 2018, p.3)

**NEW YORK STATE** 

W YORK LEGISLATION Governor Cuome Order Governor Cuomo issued an Executive Order requiring all medical insurers to cover all 'contraceptives', including the abortifacient morning after pill.

The New York State Primary Election will be held on THURSDAY, September 13, 2018. The general election will be Tuesday, November 6.

#### **Qualifications to Vote by Absentee Ballot:**

Absent from your county or, if a resident of New York City absent from said city, on Election Day.

• Unable to appear at the polls due to temporary or permanent illness or disability; or because you are the primary care giver of one or more individuals who are ill or physically disabled.

• A resident or patient of a Veterans Health Administration Hospital.

Detained in jail awaiting Grand Jury action or confined in prison after conviction for an offense other than a felony.

# **HEALTH & SCIENCE** Genetic Disruption of Human Beings



Margaret Somerville, professor of Bioethics at the School of Medicine, University of Notre Dame Australia, addressed the ethics of three-parent babies at MercatorNet.com on July 18, 2018. She stated, "Now we are faced with unprecedented 21<sup>st</sup> century reproductive technologies which can be used to change the genetic essence of ourselves (our DNA) when we are embryos and in such a way that the changes will be passed on to our future descendants. Should we do this? In other words, is it ethical to disrupt our modern-human genetic heritage which has evolved naturally over at least the last 200,000 years?" She continued, "proponents of the technology [three-parent IVF] want [the term] replaced by the less alarming and more normal and familiar sounding 'mitochondrial DNA transplants."

Currently in Australia it is criminal to create an embryo other than for reproduction, or with more than two biological parents, or who has inheritable alterations of the human germ line – genes passed on from generation to generation - or to implant such an embryo in a woman's uterus.

Somerville said, "Good facts are essential to good ethics." She then explained the technology involved in three-parent embryos. "An embryo results from the union of a man's sperm and a woman's ovum. The ovum has a DNA nucleus and, external to that, mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) in the cytoplasm surrounding the nucleus. The mtDNA is inherited only from the woman and, from the time we are conceived until we die, converts energy from nutrients to energy for the cells that constitute every human being. Some women have defective mtDNA which can result in mild to very serious disease in their children. Three-parent embryos are created using IVF and replacing the defective mtDNA of the woman who will have the child with the healthy mtDNA of another woman. This is known as mitochondrial replacement therapy (MRT) which can be carried out in four different ways, but the two most prominent are maternal spindle transfer (MST) and pronuclear transfer (PNT).

"MST involves using a donor ovum with healthy mtDNA, extracting its nuclear DNA and replacing it with the nuclear DNA removed from an ovum of the intended mother, resulting in a 'combination ovum' with mostly healthy mtDNA, which is fertilized with the father's sperm to create an embryo. Importantly, MST does not involve creating an embryo from the donor's ovum and then destroying that embryo by enucleating it. The embryo's mtDNA is only 'mostly healthy', because some of the mother's defective mtDNA in her ovum's cytoplasm is ordinarily attached to the nuclear DNA and transferred with it.

"In contrast PNT does involve creating an embryo with the intention of destroying it. An embryo is created from the future mother's ovum and the father's sperm ('mother's embryo') and another embryo from a healthy mtDNA ovum donor and the father's sperm ('donor embryo'). The nuclear DNA is removed from the 'donor embryo', destroying it, and the nuclear DNA from the 'mother's embryo' is transferred to the enucleated donor embryo creating an embryo with mostly healthy mitochondria."

There are several ethical questions regarding this process. Three-parent embryos are created using IVF technology in the lab. Those who regard the IVF process as morally unacceptable would reject this process from the outset. There are others who may have "limiting conditions". Those might include not creating more embryos than those that will be implanted, thus allowing all created embryos a chance to live. This would make MST acceptable, but not PNT, as PNT requires creating an embryo and then destroying it when the nuclear DNA is removed. Those who do not believe that embryos have any moral status would accept these procedures.

Somerville said the ethical concerns go "beyond the ethical issues raised by the technology itself to matters such as claims of rights to have a genetically related child, the ethics of alternative means of founding a family, and so on. A technology-related consideration includes the ethics of alteration of the human germline, a possibility that for many elicits intense fear and for some great hope...when we didn't have the technology to alter the germline, there was almost universal agreement among bioethicists that such alteration would always be ethically wrong. Rather, we agreed that we had obligations to hold the germline intact for future generations as the common heritage of human kind. Now, when human germline alteration has become possible, some bioethicists see it as ethically acceptable in order to avoid serious genetically transmitted diseases...If germline modification were allowed, we would need to consider whether its use as therapy for serious, otherwise untreatable, genetic diseases is ethically different from its use for enhancement, that is, creating designer children. Another issue is whether three-parent IVF would establish a precedent of the ethical acceptability of 'designer children'". She warns that we must look at the risks and harms of this procedure. It is possible for donors to be exploited. She asks if creating a threeparent embryo is "manufacturing a child...a contravention of human dignity?" Somerville also addresses the question of informed consent. Would couples consent to great risk and harm in order to have a child? Does the child have the right to know the identity of the mtDNA donor? The IVF industry would support this technology as a source of increased business. Governments would likely support it as a cost-saving measure (social services costs for children with mtDNA disease). Canadian ethicist Francois Baylis concluded that this technology is inevitable as "no genetic or reproductive technology seems to be too dangerous or too transgressive" in today's culture.


